

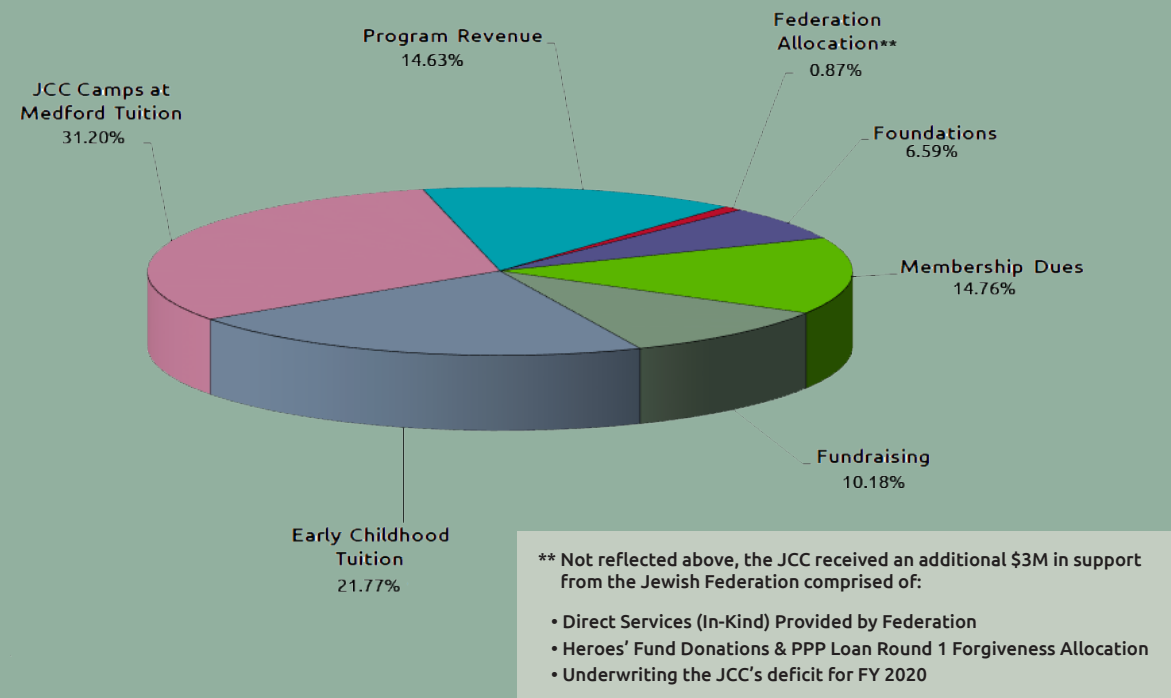

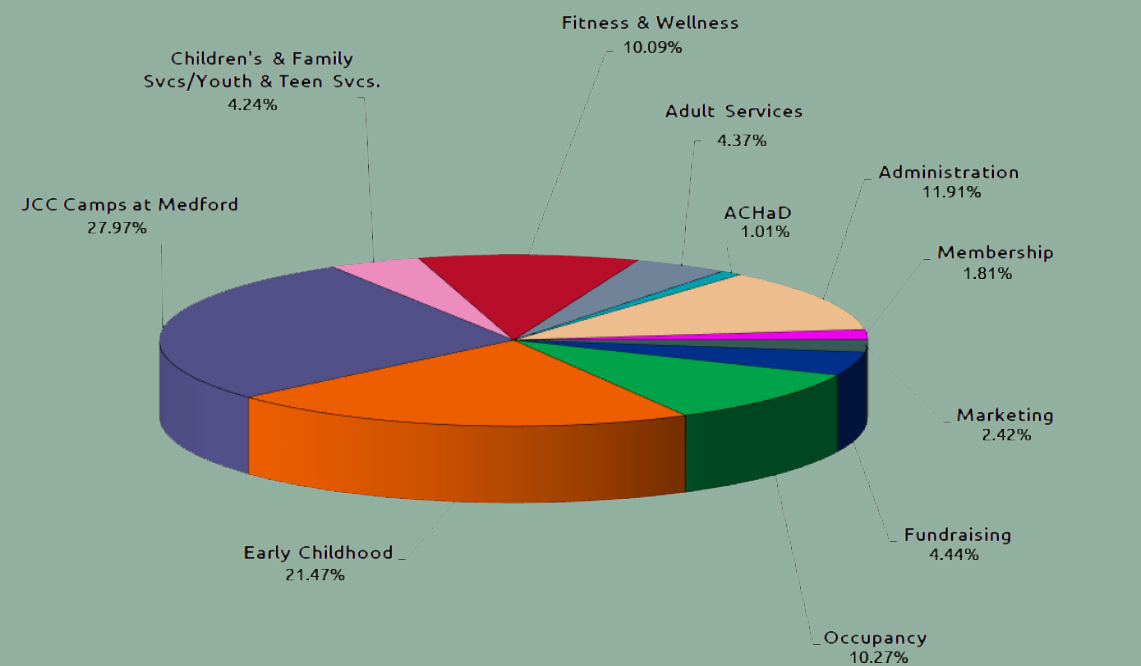

ADULT & INCLUSION

Over the past year, Shelly has been instrumental in bringing members who attend the Adult department's programs and events back into the building, particularly for the Lunch with a Friend, inviting a different friend or couple to lunch each week.
